



Statement of Satisfactory Tenancy

A reference for tenants leaving social housing

A good tenancy reference from a reputable landlord is a real advantage for tenants who are trying to move house. A Statement of Satisfactory Tenancy from a social housing provider will be especially useful as a reference for tenants moving out of social housing into private rental housing.

Who can get a Statement of Satisfactory Tenancy?

Social housing tenants with a good tenancy record who are looking to move into private rental housing can ask their social housing provider for a Statement of Satisfactory Tenancy.

What does a Statement of Satisfactory Tenancy cover?

The Statement of Satisfactory Tenancy is a written tenancy reference from the social housing provider. It answers the three main questions that landlords want to know when they are choosing a new tenant. These are:

- Have they paid their rent? (current rent payment situation or rent payment history)
- Have they caused damage to the property? (current or previous damages to the tenanted property)
- Has their behaviour been acceptable? (tenant's behaviour in the property or complaints against the tenant).

The decision to give a Statement of Satisfactory Tenancy is up to the social housing provider.
